Family ReEntry's mission is to break cycles of violence, crime and incarceration by providing client-centered interventions and support services to empower and strengthen individuals, families and communities.

Established as a nonprofit organization in 1984, Family ReEntry has been a driving force in the elimination of domestic violence occurrences, reducing incarceration rates, and increasing safety for impacted families and communities.

For over thirty years, Family ReEntry has provided culturally sensitive and trauma informed services to address issues related to domestic and intimate partner violence, prisoner pre-release and reentry services, and provided support to youth and families at risk of system involvement.

Family ReEntry implements effective services to men, women, children and families who have been impacted by problems resulting from personal trauma, victimization and incarceration. Utilizing best practices and evidence-based interventions, our programs address root causes that contribute to the cycles of violence and crime, focusing on ways to implement healthy life skills and enhancing the ability of individuals and families to better cope, lead productive lives and embrace restorative practices. In this way, Family ReEntry Programs serve the larger community in reducing risk and recidivism, as well as reducing the financial and emotional costs associated with crime and incarceration.

Family ReEntry is an innovative high impact community justice agency with evidence-based programs in three interconnected areas:

PREVENTION – Helping vulnerable youth impacted by parental incarceration, family violence and involvement in the juvenile justice system.

INTERVENTION – Stopping physical and psychological violence and abuse, protecting victims, and creating a framework for healthy relationships.

REENTRY – Reducing recidivism through preparing prisoners prior to release, utilizes successful ex-offenders as leaders, role models, and mentors, builds collaborations with stakeholders, and creates positive pro-social networks in the community.

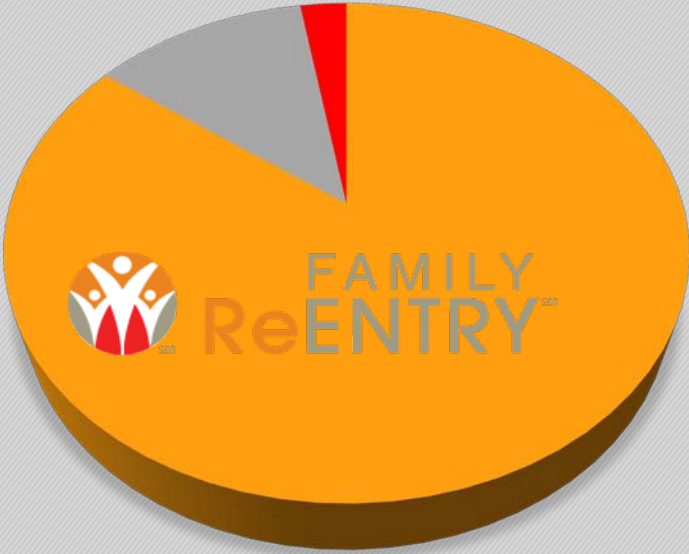

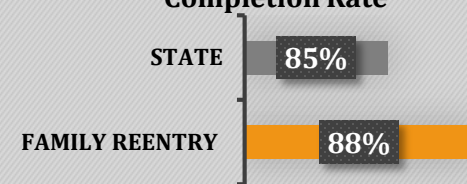

Family Violence Education Program Completion Rate



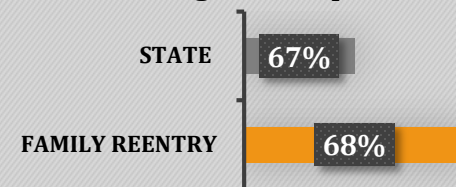

EVOLVE Program Completion Rate



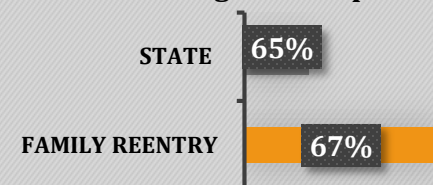

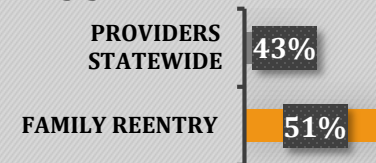

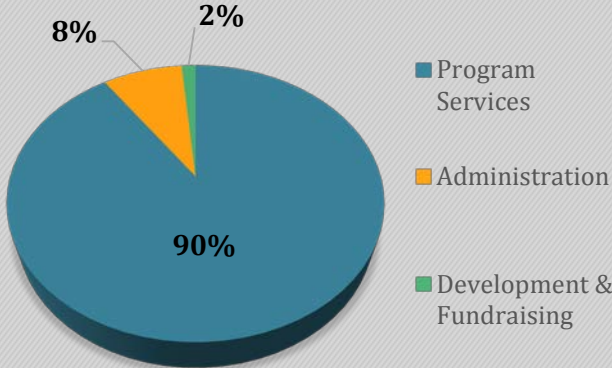
